The appointed hearing officer shall preside over all proceedings before the Council related to the proposed rule. If the assigned Council member leaves the Council through resignation, expiration of membership, or otherwise, the chair shall assign a hearing officer as a replacement and shall serve as the hearing officer in the interim before the substitute assignment is made.
167 168 169 170	(b) Any member of the public, subject to reasonable time restrictions established by the presiding officer, may address the Council at any meeting in which the Council is considering proposed rules. The Council shall allow meaningful opportunity for public comment at each rulemaking hearing.
171 172 173	(i) No person may address the Council without first being recognized by the presiding officer.
174 175 176	(ii) The Council may provide a telephonic or internet-based method to receive public comments during Council proceedings.

The 183 Council shall consider all comments to be made in a person's individual capacity unless an affiliation is disclosed to the Council. 184 185 186 In considering proposed rules, the Council shall consider all properly 187 submitted public comments. 188 189 Comments shall be directed to the Council as a whole and not to (vi) individual Council members. If a member of the public approaches an individual Council 190 member to discuss a proposed rule, that member shall direct the person to submit a comment for 191 192 full consideration by the Council. If a Council member receives information through informal 193 contact with a member of the public, that member shall disclose the contact and the information 194 received to the rest of the Council in an open meeting. If the information is reduced to writing in 195 physical or electronic format, the Council member shall provide the information to the other 196 Council members and the writing shall become part of the record. 197 198 The Council may make changes to proposed rules based on its independent (c) analysis of the form and substance of the proposed rules. In doing so, the Council may consider 199 testimony received during a rulemaking hearing and materials submitted to the rulemaking 200 201 docket. 202 In considering potential changes to proposed rules, the Council shall 203 (i) 204 consider the following: 205 206 (A) Whether the contemplated change meets all procedural requirements of the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act, including whether the change is a 207 208 logical outgrowth of the proposed rule; 209 210 Whether the opportunity for public participation was meaningful (B) and sufficient given the nature of the contemplated change to the proposed rule; 211 212 213 Whether the contemplated change imposes an unwarranted (C) 214 administrative burden on the Department; and 215 Whether the contemplated change impacts the Department's ability 216 (D) 217 to maintain primacy over the relevant regulatory area. The Council shall allow the Department to provide a primacy analysis in the context of any contemplated changes. 218 219 220 (ii) The Council shall not modify a proposed rule if the Council determines 221 that: 222 223 (A) The contemplated change conflicts with state or federal law;
