We would like to respond to the certified letter we received from Bob Holmes, owner of Rocky Mt. Ready Mix. We, as adjacent land owners are totally opposed to the expanding of this pit. Our property joins ours at the property line. We do not like the dust, noise & exhaust fumes. We do not like the peace & quiet of our home being disturbed by gravel operations. We bought our home for its location, quiet & beauty - all being taken away by this operation.

We see no reason that Rocky Mt Ready Mix should be issued this permit due to their unlawful history. Is it true that they have been in violation of their D accr permit for 2 years? This fall they blocked off irrigation ditch to dry out their property, not concerned that it would have flooded our basement had we not been home. They dug out a drain to lower a pond, without first inquiring, only to cause flooding on another adjacent property. All of this without consulting with anyone first. Why is this company allowed to continue operation when its in violation of its existing permit & why allow a permit to expand when already in violation of



what they already have? Why haven't they been fined or made to leave the pit and other companies of the same violations have had to do? It's not right the one company is fined for breaking the law + the other one is not. We don't want them to expand + don't feel they are worthy of a permit to expand.
