SUBJECT: Request for review of proposed rules for statutory authority

The Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), Water Quality Division (WQD) is proposing to revise Chapters 14 and 28 of the Water Quality Rules and Regulations. The proposed revisions to Chapter 14 include revising the requirements for financial assurance instruments for consistency with other divisions within the Department and banking statutes and regulations; clarifying the requirements for closure, post-closure, and corrective action plans; and restructuring passages in the Chapter for clarity and to meet Secretary of State formatting requirements. WQD is proposing to create a new chapter, Chapter 28, to streamline and clarify the various design, construction, operation, monitoring, and annual reporting requirements for commercial oilfield waste disposal facilities.

WQD took public comment on the proposed revisions to Chapters 14 and 28 beginning September 6, 2019 and ending October 7, 2019. WQD took additional public comment beginning April 1, 2020 and ending on May 8, 2020. On May 8, 2020, the Water and Waste Advisory Board recommended the adoption of revisions to both chapters to the Environmental Quality Council.

WQD has reviewed the requirements of W.S. 35-11-302(a)(iii) and (vi), and 35-11-313(f) of the Act and has determined this rulemaking to be in procedural compliance with the statute. WQD has reviewed and responded to the Takings Checklist provided by the Attorney General's Office. WQD is now seeking a review of the proposed rules for statutory authority before submitting the rules to the Governor's Office for permission to proceed to formal rulemaking.
