16	<u>Duckgrounu</u>
17	The State of Wyoming (State) Department of Environmental Quality, Solid and Hazardous
18	Waste Division (WDEQ/SHWD), pursuant to the authority vested in it by Wyoming Statute
19	(W.S.) § 35-11-503(a)(v) and (d), proposes that the Environmental Quality Council (Council)
20	revise Chapter 1, General Provisions of the Wyoming Hazardous Waste Rules and Regulations
21	(HWRR) to incorporate changes since the last HWRR adopted by the State on May 3, 2019. The
22	existing HWRR use Incorporation by Reference (IBR) of the Code of Federal Regulations, Title
23	40, Parts 124, 260-268, 270, 273, and 279. The following is a statement of WDEQ/SHWD's
24	principal reasons for adopting these rules, as required by Tri-State Generation & Transmission
25	Ass'n v. Envtl. Quality Council, 590 P.2d 1324, 1330-32 (Wyo. 1979).
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27	Purpose and Intent of Proposed Revisions
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29	The proposed revisions to the Wyoming HWRR, Chapter 1 include the addition of new rules or
30	revisions as defined in Checklists 233, 240, 241, 242, and 243 from the U.S. Environmental
31	Protection Agency (EPA) which have been promulgated and finalized by EPA since May 3,
32	2019, the last date of adoption of the HWRR, IBR Update 1. The WDEQ/SHWD intends to
33	adopt the rules to ensure that the HWRR are up-to-date with the federal rules as of July 7, 2020.
34	The proposed revisions to Chapter 1 incorporate both mandatory and optional EPA
35	revisions to the rules to be adopted by the State of Wyoming using incorporation by reference
36	(IBR) and address revisions to the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 40, "Protection of the
37	Environment" (40 CFR), Parts 124, 260-268, 270, 273, and 279 that were promulgated between
38	January 31, 2018 and July 7, 2020. The exception is the adoption of the Definition of a Solid
39	Waste (DSW) rule which was originally promulgated in 2015, was under litigation which has
40	been resolved, and is now being adopted. The remaining rules include the Safe Management of
41	Airbag Waste; Management Standards for Hazardous Waste Pharmaceuticals and Amendment to
12	the P075 Listing for Nicotine; Increasing Recycling by Adding Aerosol Cans to the Universal
1 3	Waste Regulation: and Modernizing Ignitable Liquids Determinations. Chapter 1 details which

- parts of the 40 CFR have been adopted by reference, as well as exceptions in each section. In
- addition, Appendix A, Table 1-1 provides a detailed list of the more stringent and broader in
- scope provisions for the State, relative to 40 CFR. The revisions also clarify and restructure
- sections in the Chapter. This revision will be the second update of the HWRR since the State
- began to use IBR to ensure that its rules are consistent with EPA's, except where more stringent
- 49 or broader in scope.

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Compliance with Federal Regulations (W.S. § 35-11-503(a)(v))

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- The proposed rule revisions are designed to be equivalent to federal regulations except where
- 54 State provisions are more stringent or broader in scope. The federal regulations incorporated by
- reference include 40 CFR Parts 124, 260-268, 270, 273 and 279. These rule changes meet or
- exceed the minimum requirements of federal laws and regulations, while maintaining state
- 57 primacy as required by W.S. § 35-11-503(d)(i).

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Public Outreach

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- WDEQ/SHWD conducted public outreach, including emailed presentations and phone calls with
- parties affected by these rules and regulations including pharmacies, hospitals, automotive
- dealerships, and RCRA permitted facilities. Outreach was conducted from December of 2019 to
- May of 2020. Based on the outreach, the WDEQ/SHWD found that the public and the regulated
- community support the adoption of the new rules for the Wyoming HWRR.

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Modifications Recommended by the Wyoming Water and Waste Advisory Board (WWAB)

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On June 29, 2021, the WWAB recommended minor changes to the draft IBR Update 2 of the HWRR rules including correction of typographical errors and clarification of text and definitions.

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The WWAB moved to forward the rules on to the Environmental Quality Council with the minor edits provided during the meeting.

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Effect of the Rule Revisions

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The Council anticipates that the proposed Wyoming HWRR revisions will benefit the regulated community in the following ways:

- 1. HWRR will be up-to-date with current 40 CFR as of July 7, 2020.
- 113 2. The revised HWRR will be consistent with those previously adopted by the State.

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- The Council anticipates that adoption by IBR of rule revisions to update the current HWRR to 40
- 116 CFR as of July 7, 2020 will benefit the State in the following ways:
- 1. Maintains state primacy.
