# DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY/AIR QUALLITY DIVISION'S MOTION REQUESTING THAT CORDERO MINING COMPANY'S MOTION TO INTERVENE BE DENIED

COMES NOW, the Department of Environmental Quality/Air Quality Division, by the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Wyoming, through Mike Barrash, Assistant Attorney General, and moves that the Environmental Quality Council deny Cordero Mining Company's motion to intervene in the above-referenced matter.

Under Chapter I, Section 16a. of the Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality Rules of Practice and Procedure (1982), Cordero could have appealed to the Council within 60 days from DEQ's final action granting air quality permit CT-208A3 to Mobil Coal Producing, Inc. Having failed to do so, Cordero should not be allowed to circumvent the time limit imposed by Chapter I, Section 16a. through a motion to intervene in the contested case (No. 1656-85) concerning air quality permit CT-208A3.

At the motion hearing in Casper on April 28, 1986, the Hearing Officer denied motions to consolidate the contested

case (No. 1656-85) concerning permit CT-208A3 with a contested case (No. 1723-86) initiated by Cordero concerning a different air quality permit. The motions to consolidate were denied on the grounds that consolidation would unduly complicate the hearing procedure and promote confusion.

condero requests permission to conduct cross-examination. At the April 28th hearing on the motion to consolidate, there was strong objection to allowing Cordero to cross-examine witnesses with respect to Mobil's permit because Cordero had failed to appeal the grant of that permit within the 60 day time limit. For the same reason, Cordero should not be allowed to intervene for that purpose.

WHEREFORE, the DEQ/AQD respectfully requests that the Council deny Cordero's Motion to Intervene in the above matter.
