Several of these proposed rules are more effective than the counterpart Federal Rules by requiring that an operator consider "ephemeral streams that have the potential for substantial flow in response to precipitation events" when designing roads that may impact such a stream. The Federal rules regarding road construction only require consideration of perennial and intermittent streams.
