Dear Mr. Boal,

On behalf of the members of the Black Hills Regional Multiple Use Coalition (see attached list of members) in Wyoming and South Dakota, I request that you not accept the petition from The Friends of Sand Creek to designate 11,000 acres of the Sand Creek Watershed as Very Rare and Uncommon at your June 24, 2008 meeting.

We all agree that the Sand Creek watershed is very special. However, our fear is that a decision to grant the Very Rare and Uncommon designation for Sand Creek would unnecessarily and inappropriately 1) limit multiple use management of the Black Hills National Forest, as outlined in the Land and Resource Management Plan, 2) stop mining exploration and implementation, 3) adversely affect agricultural uses on private lands, and 4) reduce economic benefits of natural resource management to northeast Wyoming.

Granting the Petitioners' request to designate a large portion of the Sand Creek Watershed as Very Rare and Uncommon is not necessary to maintain the values associated with Sand Creek. The national forest lands and the private agricultural lands have been carefully managed for years without the necessity of Rare and Uncommon Designation by the State of Wyoming.

Again, we do not support designating the Sand Creek watershed as Very Rare and Uncommon, and we urge you to stop this process now by not accepting the petition for consideration.
