To whom it may concern,

We are writing to you today to express our opposition to the proposal of permitting Hopper Disposal to build a new transfer station in Fremont County.

Adding a new transfer station to the county will not contribute to a more environmentally sustainable waste management system for the county. It will increase truck traffic, increase safety issue in the area of proposed transfer station, increase noise, increase odors, and have the potential of environmental impacts.

In addition to these concerns that come with a new transfer station we have tremendous concerns about the company proposed to run this transfer station. Hopper Disposal has a NOV violation with your office, and there are several allegations of other safety and environmental infractions, such as not getting correct air quality permits. We do not feel Hopper Disposal is fit to run their own transfer station due to these violations and lack of experience. In addition to concerns of environmental impact, we have great concern for the safety of those residents around this area, and for those working for them.

We feel that Fremont County already has enough places to dispose of waste in the county and that Hopper Disposal would have a negative impact to the environment and community if allowed to open another transfer Station.
