# International Programme on Chemical Safety

---

The **International Programme on Chemical Safety (IPCS)** was formed in 1980 and is a collaboration between three United Nations bodies, the World Health Organization, the International Labour Organization and the United Nations Environment Programme, to establish a scientific basis for safe use of chemicals and to strengthen national capabilities and capacities for chemical safety.<sup>[1]</sup>

A related joint project with the same aim, **IPCS INCHEM**, is a collaboration between IPCS and the Canadian Centre for Occupational Health and Safety (CCOHS).<sup>[2]</sup>

The IPCS identifies following as "chemicals of major public health concern"

- Air pollution
- Arsenic
- Asbestos
- Benzene
- Cadmium
- Dioxin and dioxin-like substances
- Inadequate or excess Fluoride
- Lead
- Mercury
- Highly hazardous pesticides <sup>[3]</sup>
