Dear Ms. Parfitt,

We are writing to protest the application which Anchor Environmental has submitted for a facility west of Mills, WY. We are concerned about the possible ground contamination and ground water contamination from that area. We are also worried about the possible air contamination and noxious odors. People live and work in that area and there is even an elementary school not far from there. The winds blow, sometimes very hard, from the south west to the east and that could carry any contamination right over that area. We had a hill on the south west part of our property. In the early 1980s the city of Casper needed some dirt for some work they were doing and we allowed them to cut down our hill, as did the owner on the west side of our fence. They had nearly completed the hauling when water started flowing. They found that they had dug into an underground stream and they stopped working. See #1 on the map. The water flowed above ground for quite a while after they left. The dotted line indicates the approximate flow of the underground stream to #2 on the map where it resurfaces. From there it flows as indicated by a solid blue line. It has flowed all these years and it is brackish, bad looking water. We feel that, though needed, that kind of work should be done out in the field away from the general population. We request that Anchor's application be denied or at least we request a public hearing in Casper on the matter.

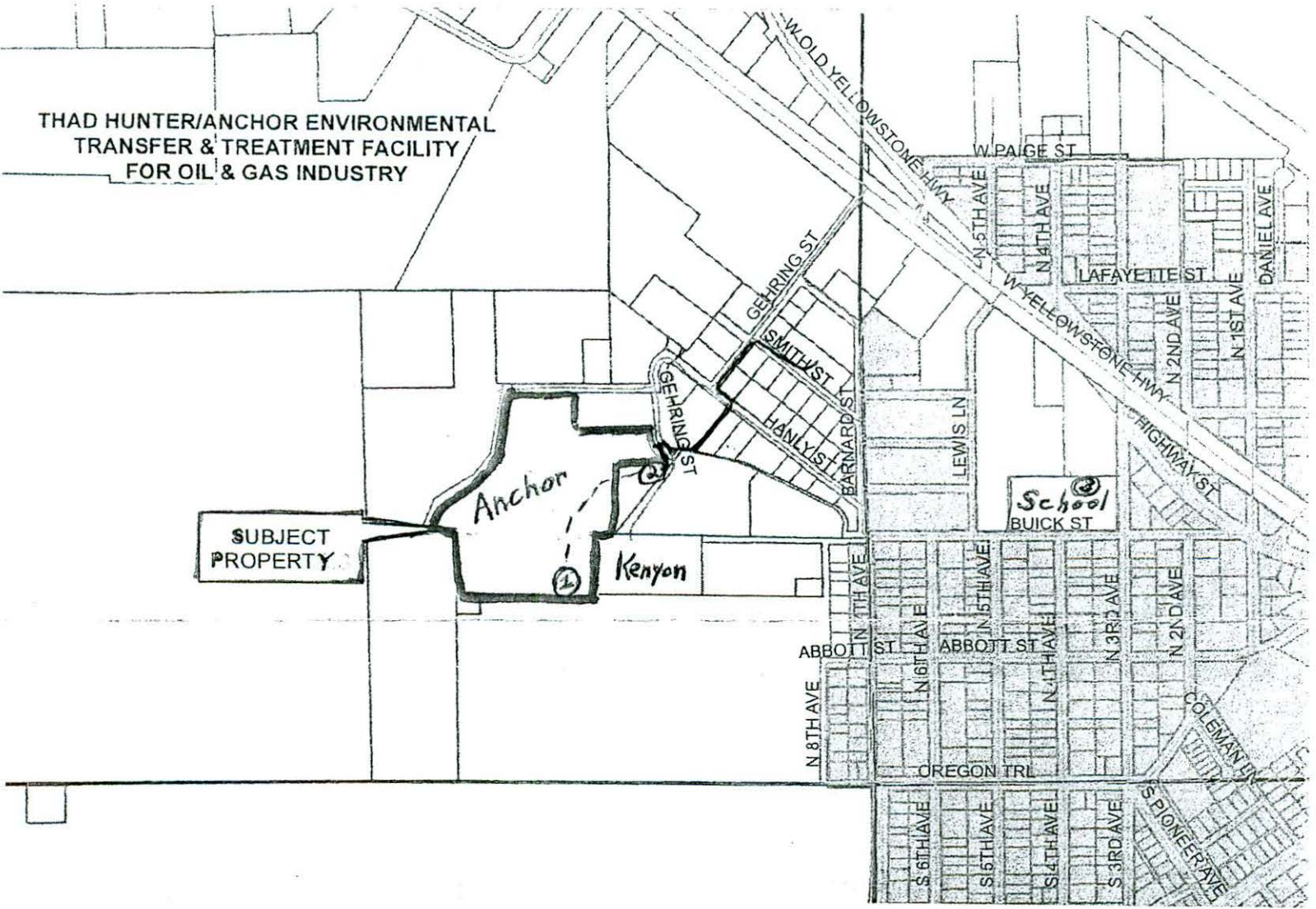
