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1 Some months ago Wind River Materials of
 2 Kemmerer, Wyo., Karen Davis and Mike and
 3 Janice Hughes brought before the Sublette Co
 4 Planning & Zoning Board an application for a
 5 small mining permit of approximately 10 acres.
 6 The application was not approved.

7
 8 We have been a ranch family operating immedi-
 9 ately adjacent to this proposed mine for
 10 over 100 years. We have studied the Wind
 11 River small mining application sent to us
 12 by John D Erickson of Lander, Wyo. This
 13 proposal is unacceptable to us. We object
 14 to the location as it is a health and
 15 safety hazard to the people young and
 16 old living in this valley. The dust, noise,
 17 big gravel truck & heavy equipment exhaust,
 18 water pollution, increased traffic & vehicle
 19 size entering and exiting highway 351
 20 convinces us that this proposal was not
 21 well thought out even for short term use.

22 #6 How can you know what school bus or
 23 any other vehicle increase will exist 10, 20
 24 or thirty years or even three years from
 25 now? There is a school bus pick up & drop
 26 off at this location now and at other residences
 27 along 351. The Wyo Transportation Access
 28 Permit #6 contains a null & void clause.

I.E. 23 Storm Pollution : These berms may be helpful in some respects but the wind deposits weeds, fine dirt & sand and snow on the down wind side of the berm building width with time like a highway snow fence. Snow melt equals runoff.

I.E. 24 Of great concern to us is the on site 10,500 gallons of fuels with irrigation ditches north and south of this storage and equipment in use. Tho the Green River is $\frac{1}{2}$ mile south of the permit area all the sloughs, irrigation and drainage ditches flow south to the river.

D6-1 Errors & Omissions : There is an important omission in this application concerning water rights on the lands around the proposed permit. Some information on well is incorrect.

D6-2 S E 0 has flow rates. We have had water every year in the ditch available for measure.

What is Wind River Materials really asking for? A mining permit = sand and gravel. Then it mentions crushing operation and cement mix periodically asphalt and finally it speaks of hot mix (hydrocarbons) Is it gravel extraction or all of the above?

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- MP 7 Water used in dust suppression & processing.
- 2 It is unclear where this water comes from
3 and how much. Irrigation water is turned
4 off seasonally.
- TF 8 5 #8 Avoiding a public nuisance.
- 6 Nuisance as defined by Webster's; annoying,
7 unpleasant, or obnoxious
- 8 The dust, noise, pollutants and safety hazards
9 should not be minimized by labeling
10 them simply a nuisance! They are very
11 serious complications when trying to
12 maintain good health and can be a financial
13 drain on those who must cope with it
- 14 We raise our children preaching "Don't
15 smoke", "Never Huff or Sniff petroleum
16 products." and then we adults put them
17 in harm's way by ignoring the dangers created
18 by man made pollution. Young children
19 with lungs still developing, people with
20 asthma, COPD or any lung restriction should
21 not be subjected to the hazards of mining
22 operations. For anyone, the damage from
23 pollution is cumulative.
- 24 The nearest homes are less than $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mile
25 from the permit area and down wind. The
26 prevailing wind is from the NW or W. Dust,
27 weeds, diesel fumes and noise will be
28 carried down wind constituting a health

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hazard of varying severity depending
on how rapidly the offending pollutants
are blown out of the valley or hang for
days in the air as more and more soil
is pushed around, trucks loaded and rocks
crushed. Constant noise can be very stressful,
even at low levels. Especially if or when a
person has lived their whole life away
from it.

Granting this permit at this location for
3 or 30 years would be giving an agricultural
and recreation area over to heavy industry
because it displaces or discourages
other uses with its heavy disruptive
foot print. In the past we have experienced
3 gravel operations within 1½ + 2 miles
of our home. Those were well up off the
meadows and away from the river but
we still had dust & noise even at that
distance. The big trucks coming on & off
35+ were definitely a safety factor.

We have had the time and good fortune
to visit with people who live in different
areas of Sublette Co., near gravel pits,
crushing and haul roads. We are grateful
for their comments candidly given of their
experiences. Sublette Co is presently non-
compliant with air quality.

Please give us your time to come to
our area and hold a public discussion
or hearing and look, on the ground, at
the site being proposed.

We believe there are places where gravel
extraction is fitting and beneficial.

That the harm can be held to an
acceptable level and away from a grow-
ing population. That place is not here!

We look forward to a hearing with
you and an honest discussion.
