NOTICE OF VIOLATION AND ORDER

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT:

- The City of Cheyenne (Cheyenne) was authorized to discharge storm water under a Large 1. Construction General storm water permit (LCGP) WYR103820 during the development and construction associated with the Dry Creek-Sheridan Reach Flood Control project. Cheyenne received authorization through the Wyoming Pollution Discharge Elimination System (WYPDES), authorization WYR103820 on June 23, 2010 from a transfer of the permit from the previous owner, Tarco, Inc.
- Section 3.11.2 of the LCGP states: Deadline to renew- "All permittees that receive coverage 2. under this automatic process must submit an NOI, or other form as provided by the Administrator, to this office by July 9, 2011 to maintain coverage under this general permit. Operators who fail to do so will have their coverage under this permit terminated. Construction sites that are not "finally stabilized," and where coverage lapses, may be subject to an enforcement action.
- 3. The LCGP states in Section 5.2: Compliance with the conditions of this permit is required until an NOT has been submitted and accepted by the Department. Failure to comply is a violation of the LCGP requirements. Section 5.3 states, "Failure to submit an NOT shall result in continued accrual of annual permit fees until such time that an NOT is received and accepted by the DEQ."
- 4. On January 28, 2011 a letter was sent to Cheyenne informing them that the authorization for WYR103820 would expire on March 15, 2011 and a new LCGP would be required along with revisions that may affect actions taken to comply with the permit. To date Cheyenne has not applied for a renewal of the authorization.
- 5. Cheyenne submitted a Notice of Termination (NOT) requesting to be relieved of the LCGP requirements in January 2012. Upon receipt of the request WQD completed a site visit of the area on January 4, 2012 and determined the requirements of 70% vegetative coverage had not been achieved and the request for termination was denied.
- 6. The Large Construction General Permit-Storm water states in Section 10.21: Permit Actions: This permit may be modified, revoked and reissued, or terminated for cause. The filing of a request by a permittee for a permit modification, revocation and reissuance, or termination, or a notification of planned changes or anticipated noncompliance does not stay any permit condition.
- 7. On June 7, 2013 the WDEQ/WQD Nonpoint Source Program Coordinator visited the site for an evaluation of the project. During the visit several deficiencies relating to water quality were noted in the project area. Concerns noted included: (1) failure to maintain Best Management

Practices (BMPs) to control erosion resulting in large areas of deposited sediment and developing headcuts along the banks of the retention basins and other parts of the drainage system. WDEQ recommended that corrective action take place to mitigate adverse impacts to water quality that were occurring due to lack of BMP maintenance and promote long-term stability of the system. These deficiencies were in direct correlation to lack of site stabilization and BMP maintenance which are LCGP requirements. A copy of this report was provided to Cheyenne with the recommendations outlined on page 8.

8. The Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality, Water Quality Division (WQD) conducted an inspection of the facility on April 11, 2014. Violations from this inspection included the following: (1) operating without a renewed permit, (2) failure to maintain Best Management Practices (BMPs) to control erosion and transport of pollutants, and (3) failure to meet the 70% coverage requirement to allow for termination of the permit. Currently the site is not stabilized and the storm water discharge authorization from the previous permit has expired. Therefore, any storm water discharging from the site is unauthorized and in violation of the Wyoming Environmental Quality Act and is grounds for enforcement action.

This Notice is being sent to you pursuant to W.S. 35-11-701(c)(i), which requires that in any case of the failure to correct or remedy an alleged violation, the director of the Department of Environmental Quality shall cause a written notice to be issued and served upon the person alleged to be responsible.

ORDER

BEFORE THE ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY COUNCIL - STATE OF WYOMING

WHEREFORE IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- Within 45 days of the mailing of this NOV and Order Cheyenne shall address site stabilization with implementation and/or upgrading BMPs (Best Management Practices) as required in the corrective actions outlined in Part III of DEQ's inspection report and maintain the site to achieve stabilization with 70% vegetation coverage and the potential for a discharge of storm water and other pollutants has been eliminated.
- 2. Within 14 days of receipt of this NOV and Order Cheyenne shall complete and submit the required Notice of Intent (NOI) and fees for a new LCGP permit.

This ORDER is final unless, no later than ten (10) days after the date this notice is received; it is appealed by filing two written requests for a hearing before the Environmental Quality Council. If a hearing is requested, the first hearing petition shall be mailed to the Chairman, Wyoming Environmental Quality Council, Room 1714 Herschler Building, 1st Floor West, 122 West 25th St., Cheyenne, Wyoming 82002. The second petition shall be mailed to the Director, Wyoming Department of the Environmental Quality, Herschler Building, 4th Floor West, 122 West 25th St., Cheyenne, Wyoming 82002. Both petitions must be sent by certified mail, return receipt requested.

NOTHING IN THIS NOTICE OF VIOLATION (NOV) AND ORDER shall be interpreted to in any way limit or contravene any other remedy available under the Environmental Quality Act, nor shall this NOV AND ORDER be interpreted as being a condition precedent to any other enforcement action.
