13	STATEMENT OF PRINCIPAL REASONS			
14	<u> </u>			
15	<u>Background</u>			
16				
17	The State of Wyoming (State) Department of Environmental Quality, Solid and Hazardous			
18	Waste Division (WDEQ/SHWD), pursuant to the authority vested in it by Wyoming Statutes			
19	(W.S.) 35-11-503(a)(v) and 35-11-503(d), proposes that the Environmental Quality Council			
20	(Council) revise the Wyoming Hazardous Waste Rules and Regulations (HWRR) to a single			
21	amended chapter (Chapter 1). The revised HWRR represent a reduction from 14 chapters to a			
22	single chapter utilizing Incorporation By Reference (IBR) of specific parts of Title 40 of the			
23	Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) per W.S. 16-3-103(h)(i) – (v). Over 30 states have utilized			
24	either total or partial IBR for their hazardous waste rules, including the states of Idaho, Montana,			
25	and South Dakota. The existing HWRR were adopted by the State in 2008, however these rules			
26	have not been authorized by EPA. The last HWRR authorized by EPA date back to 2002.			
27				
28	Purpose and Intent of Proposed Revisions			
29				
30	The proposed revisions to the Wyoming HWRR are intended to provide for a concise, up-to-			
31	date, simple set of HWRR which specify where Wyoming is more stringent than, or broader in			
32	scope than, the federal hazardous waste rules and regulations at 40 CFR. Sections adopted by			
33	reference within the amended Chapter 1 generally correspond with equivalent relevant parts of			
34	40 CFR (e.g. Section 266 corresponds with 40 CFR Part 266). The proposed revisions include			
35	reductions in the number of rules chapters and the number of pages of rules, which meets the			
36	request by Governor Mead (memo dated April 9, 2013) to streamline rules and regulations in the			
37	State. Obsolete HWRR have been removed to provide for consistency with federal rules. Other

rules have been removed to eliminate duplication within WDEQ, such as Maximum Available

Control Technology (MACT) standards, which belong in the Air Quality Division (AQD).

41 Compliance with Federal Regulations (W.S. 35-11-503(a)(v))

- 43 The proposed rule revisions are designed to be equivalent to federal regulations except where the
- 44 State is more stringent, or broader in scope. The federal regulations incorporated by reference
- 45 include 40 CFR Parts 124, 260 -268, 270, 273 and 279. These rule changes meet or exceed the
- 46 minimum requirements of federal laws and regulations, while maintaining State primacy per
- 47 W.S. 35-11-503(d)(i). The WDEQ/SHWD received 54 pages of comments from EPA and their
- 48 contractor, DPRA on April 29, 2014 regarding the draft IBR rules dated January 29, 2014. The
- 49 WDEQ/SHWD provided a written Response to Comments to the EPA dated May 19, 2014. The
- 50 HWRR presented today incorporate a majority of the EPA/DPRA suggestions for the IBR rules.
- 51 The WDEQ/SHWD chose to retain important statutory or State-specific language in some
- 52 provisions instead of implementing all of the EPA/DPRA recommendations.

Public Outreach

54 55

- 56 WDEQ/SHWD conducted public outreach concerning the possibility of adopting IBR for the
- 57 Wyoming HWRR. The outreach included visits and conference calls with the states of Idaho and
- 58 Montana (states that adopted IBR), several industry members, and an environmental group.
- 59 Outreach was conducted from June to September 2013. Based on the outreach, the
- 60 WDEQ/SHWD found that the different organizations overwhelmingly supported the adoption of
- IBR for the Wyoming HWRR. 61

- p. Omission of federal language at 40 CFR 270.22(a)(6) making Wyoming more stringent than federal rules, old Chapter 3, Section 2(m)(i)(F), "Data in lieu of trial burn."

- 2. Replaced obsolete language relating to the WDEQ Water Quality Division Rules and Regulations in old Chapter 4, Section 1(a)(xii)(F)(IV), under 40 CFR 270.30(1)(6), "Twentyfour (24) hour reporting."
- 164 3. Removed obsolete language regarding State authorization and primacy:
 - a. Facilities with pre-existing federal hazardous waste management permits, old Chapter 1, Section 2(a)(i) and (ii).
 - b. Dated language related to original authorization of State Hazardous Waste Management Program, in old Chapter 4, Section 2(c)(iv), "State Continuation", 40 CFR 270.51(d).
 - c. Language relating 40 CFR Part 265 to the status of a facility at the time of original authorization of the Wyoming Hazardous Waste Management Program, old Chapter 11, Section 1(a)(vi)(B) and (C), under 40 CFR 265.1(c)(4).
 - d. Dated language related to State assumption of RCRA primacy, old Chapter 11, Section 3, "Effect of Federal Permits and Consent Agreements, Stipulations, and Decrees Upon State Assumption of RCRA Primacy."
 - 4. Removed obsolete landfill and land treatment facility language (Previous rules language was specific to one facility in Wyoming that no longer exists. Any new landfarms would be required to meet HWRR):
 - a. Descriptive final cover requirements under "Specific Part B Information Requirements for Land Treatment Facilities" (40 CFR 270.20), Old Chapter 3, Section 2(k)(vi)
 - b. Required details of the leachate collection and removal system under "Specific Part B Information Requirements for Landfills" (40 CFR 270.21) in old Chapter 3, Section 2(1)(ii)(A)(I), 40 CFR 270.21(b)(1)(i).
 - c. Landfarm loading limits and final cover requirements, language in old Chapter 10, Section 12(k)(vi) and (vii), under 40 CFR 264.280.
 - 5. Modified obsolete language requiring three copies for submitted permit applications from old Chapter 3, Section 1(a)(i), under 40 CFR 124.3(a)(1). Permit applications are very large documents, and this rule did not account for electronic submittals of applications. By modifying the provision, we are preventing waste of paper resources while ensuring that the State has an adequate submittal of one copy for the permit application.

<u>Modifications Recommended by the Wyoming Water and Waste Advisory Board (WWAB) on 7/25/14</u>

On July 25, 2014, the WWAB recommended the following changes to the draft IBR rules to make them easier to use and to eliminate dated provisions from the rules:

- 1. The more stringent provision regarding daily versus weekly inspections of tanks (40 CFR 264.195(d), 265.195(c), and 265.201(d); old Chapter 10, Section 9(f)(iv), old Chapter 11, Section 11(f)(iii) and (l)(vii)) has been removed at the request of the WWAB, as most facilities now use automated leak detection systems for tanks.
- 2. The more stringent provision regarding the requirement for permittees to use monitoring technologies meeting the accuracy requirements of the Director has been removed. The former State provision (40 CFR 270.30(j); old Chapter 4, Section 1(a)(x)(D)) also required the permittee to adopt the proper technology when renewing or modifying a permit if the Director required more accurate monitoring. The federal code does not contain accuracy requirements for the purposes of monitoring. As EPA guidance already requires sampling and analysis plans (SAPs) and quality assurance project plans (QAPPs) which cover monitoring, this obsolete provision has been removed from the IBR rules.
- 3. The use of carots ("^") to denote deletion of Federal language has been removed from the rules. The carots have been eliminated, as the IBR rules already represent the Wyoming differences between the State rules language and the 40 CFR.
- 4. Confusing language related to the placement of liquids in landfills has been removed from the second column in Appendix A, Table 1-1, under the RCRA topic "Landfills" in two places.
- 5. Under Section 4(a)(v), the definition for "Chronic" has been modified from the original State language to be "That point in time time period from seven years to a lifetime."
- 6. After the WWAB meeting, an additional provision was added by DEQ under Section 264 as Section 264(a)(xi) which references 40 CFR 264.552(a)(3)(iii). This more stringent provision applies to landfills, and is consistent with the more stringent provision under "LANDFILLS" in Table 1-1 of Appendix A. The State HWRR reference was also updated from HWRR 264(e)(i) to HWRR 264(a)(xi) in the table, which is a more accurate State reference.

Effect of the Rule Revisions

- The Council anticipates that the proposed IBR rule revisions will benefit the regulated community in the following ways:
- 1. The HWRR will provide for simplified compliance with federal regulations, and will be easier to understand. The IBR HWRR will facilitate comparison of State HWRR with those from other States and the 40 CFR.
- 302 2. The IBR HWRR will eliminate onerous and confusing internal State cross-references in the current HWRR.
- 304 3. HWRR will be up-to-date with current 40 CFR as of January 31, 2014.
- 4. More stringent and broader in scope provisions in the HWRR will be clearly outlined and described relative to 40 CFR.
- 5. Numbered sections of the Chapter 1 HWRR generally match equivalent parts of 40 CFR.
- 6. The revised HWRR will be consistent with those previously adopted by the State, with out-of-date or duplicated rules removed accordingly.
- 7. The IBR HWRR (one chapter of ca. 60 pages) will be much more concise than the present
 HWRR (14 chapters of ca. 1385 pages).

- 313 The Council anticipates that adoption by IBR, including revisions to update the current HWRR
- 314 to 40 CFR as of January 31, 2014, will benefit the State in the following ways:
- 315 1. Maintains State primacy.
- 2. The State of Wyoming will be up-to-date with the current 40 CFR as of January 31, 2014.
- 3. Less expense and time commitment for State adoption of future rule revisions. Less
- paperwork and less regulatory time will be required to maintain the HWRR package for the State.
- 4. Shorter review times for proposed HWRR during the State adoption process and shorter review times for the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) during State authorization
- of proposed HWRR.
- 5. Eliminates automatic adoption of 40 CFR new rules based on language in the Chapter which contains a "date certain" provision in the HWRR.
