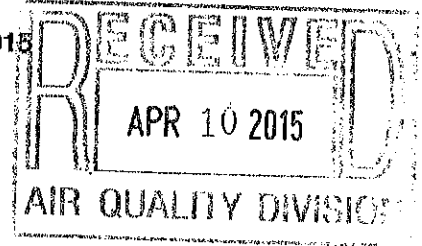

We have followed the issue of air quality degradation in the Upper Green River area for a long time, and we know you are considering adopting new air pollution controls for that part of our state.

We write to urge you to follow through and implement that set of new rules, which will help to protect the health and quality of life of our neighbors in the Upper Green.

It is our understanding that the modifications primarily address dangerous air pollution generated from existing sources such as pumps, compressors, and other oil and gas equipment already in place. The leak detection and repair protocol under consideration has a long and successful track record in other regions suffering from such pollution, and there's every reason to believe such would be the case in the Upper Green.

Therefore, we hope you can take the steps necessary for quick resolution and adoption of the rules under consideration. The long history of ozone pollution in that region of our state should have been nipped in the bud long ago.
